

Cast iron fixings

Free standing

For very secure sites, indoor locations or uses which may require the seat or bench to be repositioned, seats can be left unanchored.

Ground bolting - Leibig bolts (set of 4)

Where a solid foundation already exists, seats may be secured to the ground using bolts through the pre-drilled seat foot.

For cast iron framed seats, Liebig expansion bolts, S-2092, can be supplied at an additional cost.


Extension legs (set of 4)

For most seats, extension legs, S-2082 can be supplied at an additional cost, for bolting to seat feet and anchoring into a concrete fixing pad.


Seat legs can also be secured between paving slabs.

Submerged fixing


The seat leg is extended and inserted directly into concrete. Diagram shows the BX 2031 Pierhead bench securely bolted to a concrete block below ground level.




Free standing.
